NOTE FROM SHELBY

A lot has been happening with The Human Survival Project in recent months.

During the COVID-19 lockdowns, when ordinary people started fun hobbies like baking or gardening, I started working to save humanity from destruction. The Human Survival Project was born. I worked on it solo for about three years - researching, writing, planning, learning how to do a podcast, YouTube channel, and how to make a website, etc. I took it as far as possible independently, but I needed teammates. I found more help than I could have imagined.

I posted online in the spring of 2023, hoping to find a couple of volunteer interns. I was stunned by the flood of responses. In two rounds of recruiting in May and August, about 500 people have applied to volunteer with us. There might have been more applicants, but I pulled the plug - I couldn't handle it anymore. The enormous interest in working with The Human Survival Project gives me optimism.

Many young people are eager to work to improve humanity's chances of survival. And The Human Survival Project resonates with people. We're onto something here. I was astounded by the talent of these applicants. The large number of applicants allowed me to be very selective. I brought on a team of about 20 people at the beginning of summer. A few have moved on to other things, and many have remained, joined by new additions this fall. These are amazingly talented people and so enjoyable to work with.
